WELCOMING ZACHARY BACK TO SCHOOL!

Zachary, an 8-yearold John Ehrhardt Elementary School student, has been battling leukemia since June of 2020. The Sacramento Sheriff's Office joined John Ehrhardt



Elementary School students and faculty, Elk Grove Police Department and Cosumnes Fire Department in welcoming Zachary to school.

The beads Zachary wears around his neck are "beads of courage." They represent milestones, surgeries, blood transfusions, clinic visits, the times he had a low white blood cell count, the 70 days he spent in the hospital, shaving his head, and beads for being discharged from the hospital.



Zachary receives daily treatments which will continue through October, 2022. The tremendous strength and courage Zachary has shown is nothing short of amazing, which has garnered him the superhero nickname, "Zach Attack!"



To Zachary and the Rieger family, thank you for letting us be a part of this wonderful milestone. The Sacramento Sheriff's Office offers our prayers to Zachary and his family, and we wish him a full recovery.

Deputies held barbeques at multiple schools to celebrate the end of the school year!










YOUTH LEADERSHIP COUNCIL (YLC)


